The 13 team members raised over \$5,400 while SONH raised nearly \$900,000 over the course of the Penguin Plunge weekend. The Special Olympics strives to create a better world by fostering the acceptance and inclusion of all people. Through the power of sports, people with intellectual disabilities discover new strengths and abilities. Athletes find joy, confidence, and fulfillment — on the playing

field and in life. They inspire their communities to open their hearts to a wider world of human talents and potential.

The Penguin Plunge is a significant fundraiser for the Special Olympics of New Hampshire and helps support 3,000 athletes. Team members participating in the Penguin Plunge included students Sophia Borgesi, Olivia Dwyer, Abbie Lucas, Katie Meuse, Rex Sullivan, and Lila Woekel.
